Rebecca Reed Kantrowitz and Joanna Masingila, co-chairs, welcomed the group.

Minutes from the March meeting were approved.

Students from A Men's Issue and Femme Noire discussed plans for Slut Walk, a transnational movement of activist marches that protests explaining or excusing rape by referring to any aspect of a woman's appearance or dress. Task Force members had some questions and suggestions for the students and encouraged the students to continue to work with University officials to help ensure a safe and successful event.

"It's on Us" week events were reviewed. The week was judged to have gone well. The Task Force members suggested that it would be good for us to benchmark our "It's on Us" efforts against those of other schools and colleges, and publicize our success.

Representatives of the committees reported:

The Communications Committee worked on It's On Us week.

The Education Committee is re-examining its role as it relates to the work already being done by the Office of Health Promotion.

The Assessment Committee has gleaned ideas for moving forward on assessment.

The group discussed strategies for next year:

There was discussion about right-sizing the group and changing the frequency of meeting. Members felt that a broad-based group was good and that there is no expectation that everyone will attend every meeting.

Barry L. Wells summarized how and why the Task Force was designed in the beginning, based on the recommendations of the Education Advisory Board. There was a desire for the Task Force to be inclusive, which resulted in a very large group.

It is important to include students, especially those who are already doing the work. Students should be involved in the selection process of their representatives on the Task Force.

There was discussion of the goals and purpose of the group. This is a permanent group and it is meant to identify gaps, assess needs, access appropriate resources, and see projects through to completion. It is not necessary to have the Chancellor's approval on everything.

The Task Force should advocate for more resources for existing entities such as the Office of Health Promotion and the Office of Equal Opportunity, Inclusion and Resolution Services.

The group will develop a plan for on-boarding new members.

At the next meeting, the group will solidify its recommendations for what the Task Force will be going forward.
